Statistical Data Report for August 2024, Released October 2024

State Employment and Unemployment

Unemployment rates were higher in August in 6 states and the District of Columbia, lower in 1 state, and stable in 43 states, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported. Twenty-five states and the District had jobless rate increases from a year earlier, 4 states had decreases, and 21 states had little change. The national unemployment rate changed little over the month at 4.2 percent but was 0.4 percentage point higher than in August 2023.

Nonfarm payroll employment increased in 4 states, decreased in 1 state, and was essentially unchanged in 45 states and the District of Columbia in August 2024. Job gains occurred in Texas (+78,000, or +0.6 percent), Indiana (+19,800, or +0.6 percent), Minnesota (+14,400, or +0.5 percent), and Wisconsin (+11,600, or +0.4 percent). Meanwhile, job losses occurred in South Dakota (-3,100, or -0.7 percent).

Over the year, nonfarm payroll employment increased in 30 states and was essentially unchanged in 20 states and the District. The largest job gains occurred in Texas (+302,400), California (+287,100), and Florida (+207,400). The largest percentage increases occurred in Missouri and South Carolina (+3.3 percent each), followed by Montana (+3.1 percent).






